2. IPF grants will not be used to support political candidates, legislation, or political causes.
3. Requests are due by **June 20** and **December 19, 2025** and will be reviewed by the IPF grant committee at its subsequent meeting

Applications will be assessed primarily based on how well the study fits the mission of the Iowa Psychological Foundation. Scoring considerations include:

- Does this study cultivate public understanding and support the strengthening of health, productivity, and happiness of Iowans?
  - Studies which involve direct intervention are preferred over those which focus on theory
  - High quality research, with good consideration of power, are preferred
  - A direct focus on, or clear relevance to, Iowans is preferred
  - Focus on underserved populations is preferred (e.g. rural, minority, low SES, etc.)
- How does this study support psychology students in Iowa conducting research?
  - Preference is given to expenditure of funds that is specific and direct to the study being described
  - Preference is given to studies with other sources of funding
  - Preference is given to students who will graduate with a degree in Psychology
  - Preference is given to students who are closer to graduation

The amount of grant funds awarded each cycle will vary based on the quality and type of applications received, and the Iowa Psychological Foundation's budget. In the past, individual award amounts have typically ranged from \$250 to \$2000.
